It has been lovely to see all the children back from their Easter holidays and looking forward to a very busy summer term. Walking to school – Walking Bus

On Monday you would have seen several members of staff, Governors and our Neighbourhood Wardens handing out leaflets and talking to parents about our plans to set up a **Walking Bus.** Although it is still early days we are hoping that this new initiative will be well supported and that as the weather improves we will see more and more of our children walking to school across the recreation ground rather than being dropped off right outside the school.

Even walking part of the way to school will help to increase your child's level of fitness as well as reduce the volume of traffic in and around the school.

Children who regularly walk some or all of the way to school will be given rewards either through the class Dojo system or by receiving special badges.

<u>Swimming</u>

Many thanks to everyone who has volunteered to help with swimming this term. We are so fortunate to have our own pool on the school site and your help is very important to us. This term we are joined by Mrs Treadwell who, as a qualified swimming coach, will be providing staff training so that children's experience of school swimming will be of the very highest standard. Mrs Treadwell has also been supporting our Cross Country Running Club.

Could we ask parents when helping with swimming to talk to the teacher about the health and safety around the pool and pool cover and collect some safety notes from the office to read at your leisure. Please come suitably dressed with covered shoes, **No flip-flops** as we don't want any injuries.



Keeping children safe in the sun



Please apply sun cream to children before they come to school, as a school we not permitted to hold sun cream in school or apply sun cream to a child. Children must **NOT** Share sun cream with any other child for Health & Safety reasons. All children must bring a sun hat and a refillable drinks bottle. Children must not apply sun cream immediately before going swimming as this reacts to the chemical levels in the pool, if you child is swimming during the day it is fine to put sun cream on them before coming to school.

Parent Questionnaire

Thank you to everyone who completed this questionnaire. Overall the results are extremely positive especially regarding children's safety and progress.

The issue surrounding the behaviour of some children is one which we had already identified and we are continuing to work closely with these children and their families.

How the school deals with bullying is also an area that we are working on and, in particular, we are looking for ways of developing children's resilience and encouraging them to tell an adult whenever an issue arises. It was interesting to see that nearly 20% of parents were not sure whether or not we deal with bullying effectively; presumably because it has not been an issue for them or their child.

Likewise the percentage of parents who were not sure how well the school is led and managed or how well the school deals with concerns suggests that these may not be issues that they have had any reason to consider.

Naturally we are concerned that nearly 10% of parents would not recommend St Mary's to another parent. This figure is significantly higher than we would have hoped and is clearly something that we need to address. On looking at this more closely a number of parents who said they would not recommend the school qualified their response by adding that this was due to individual children rather than staff or any other underlying issues, **please see summary of the results attached**.

'Caring, Sharing and Daring' U.K. and Austria class

As part of our topic entitled 'Caring, Sharing and Daring' U.K. and Austria class were interested to learn about two careers that involve caring for people and animals. Each adult talked to the children about what they have to do on a day to day basis as part of their job. Mrs. Elvey talked about her day at Worthing Hospital which involves catheter angiography; this produces very detailed, clear and accurate pictures of the blood vessels around the heart.

Mrs. Richardson- Livesley works in the Equine Department at Brinsbury College and teaches students how to care for horses. The children then had the opportunity to ask lots of questions and to find out more information. Both inspired lots of role-play! We would like to thank Mrs. Elvey and Mrs. Richardson-Livesley for giving up their time.

Public Health announcement from Gaston Farm

There have been diagnosed cases of the highly infectious diarrhoea illness caused by Cryptosporidium in the area.

The warning from Public Health England states that anybody diagnosed with this should not attend school for 48hrs after recovery and not swim for two weeks after the symptoms have ended. As we begin our swimming sessions at St Mary's please let the school office know if your child has been diagnosed with Cryptosporidium during the Easter holidays.

May we also take the opportunity to remind you of the school policy for any sickness and/or diarrhoea, a child should not return to school until 48hrs after the last episode of sickness or diarrhoea.

Mining Bees


