Please remember to listen to your child read at home and write in their reading log as regularly as possible; this has a significant impact on progress and really supports the reading activities that take place in class. If you have any queries regarding reading, please let me know.

Spelling tests will continue to take place on Tuesdays. Please make sure that orange spelling books are returned to school, so that the children can complete their tests in the back, and new spelling lists can be stuck in. Spelling books will be returned on Tuesdays or Wednesdays – please continue to help your child to learn these at home to consolidate their understanding of the sounds we are covering in class. We will continue to encourage the children to demonstrate their phonic knowledge of the sounds that they have learnt in their written work.
