Dear Parents of Thailand Class,

Welcome back! I hope you all had a fantastic Easter holiday and enjoyed the sunshine!

It is lovely to see the children refreshed and ready for their third and final term in Year 1. The themes we will be covering are 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and 'Summer at the Seaside.'

Swimming sessions this term will take place on Thursday at 10:45 and on alternate Friday afternoons. However, due to the time allocation (on a Friday) only half the class will swim one week and the other half the next time it is our session. PE (games) will continue to take place on a Thursday with Miss Dunstall.

Please make sure that earrings are removed and girls with long hair have a swimming hat.

<u>We require written consent if you would like your child to wear goggles for our swimming lessons.</u> Sun cream can be applied at home in the morning and cannot be applied just prior to swimming. If your child has a verruca please purchase a verruca sock from the chemist so they can swim. Thank you.

As usual please make sure that all items of clothing are clearly marked with your child's name especially now we are swimming each week.

The children will also need to have a named water bottle in school, (particularly important this term in the warmer weather!)

Please remember to listen to your child read at home and write in their reading log as regularly as possible; this has a significant impact on progress and really supports the reading activities that take place in class. If you have any queries regarding reading, please let me know.

Spelling tests will continue to take place on Thursday. Please make sure that orange spelling books are returned to school, so that the children can complete their tests in the back, and new spelling lists can be stuck in. Spelling books will be returned on Fridays - please continue to help your child to learn these at home to consolidate their understanding of the sounds we are covering in class. We will continue to encourage the children to demonstrate their phonic knowledge of the sounds that they have learnt in their written work.
