Weather Warning



As the weather is turning so much colder and there is a risk of ice on the playground, please could everyone be extra careful. When we discover ice on the playground a 'salt path' will be prepared from the gate across the front playground to the main school and then around the outside of the school to the back playground. The 'salt path' will then go straight across the back playground to the doors opposite USA classroom.

Please make sure that you and your children remain on the prepared path. Although playing on the ice may seem tempting, it does carry a significant risk of falling over and getting hurt. The children have all been warned about the dangers and told to stay away from icy patches on the playground. Please also be aware that the public pavements may also be icy and extra care needs to be taken. As a school we are not allowed to put salt on public pavements.

Car Parking



Yet another plea to ask you to be careful about where you park when dropping off or collecting children from school. If you see cars parked partly on the pavement, on the yellow zigzag lines or blocking driveways, please either contact Operation Crackdown (www.operationcrackdown.org.uk) or pass the registration numbers on to the school. I would also ask that parents do <u>not</u> use the entrance to the school car park as a dropping off point or turning area. Again this poses a threat to children's safety and persistent

offenders will be reported to Operation Crackdown.

Head lice

Once again we seem to attracting more than our fair share of head lice and we really do appreciate your co-operation in dealing with this problem. Regular wet-combing with conditioner helps to catch these creatures and also discourages them from breeding. I would ask that you check your child's hair at least twice a week and if you see live lice or nits (the eggs) please treat your child. They do not need to be kept off school if they have head lice. Please also ensure that if your child has hair that is longer than shoulder length, it is tied back, either in a pony-tail or plait. There are many websites which contain useful information for treating this problem, and I would recommend www.nhs.uk, Paper copies of the information from this website are available from the School Office.

Scarlet Fever

We have had several cases of scarlet fever in the school, both last term and this term. The symptoms of scarlet fever include a **sore throat**, **headache**, high temperature (38.3C/101F) or above), flushed face and **swollen** tongue. The distinctive pink-red **rash** develops 12 to 48 hours later. It is treated with antibiotics. Once the child has had 24 hours of antibiotics they may return to school. If you are worried that your child may have this disease, please ring your doctor who will advise you.

Dates for your diaries

I realise that it is a few weeks off, but whole class photographs will be taken on Wednesday 3 February. I would be grateful if you could make sure that your children are wearing sweatshirts, preferably school sweatshirts, and that the girls with hair that is shoulder-length or longer have their hair tied back on that day. Please also ensure that any hair ties are dark blue or white and do not involve huge bows and ribbons. If you wish to purchase new school uniform, School Togs will be in the playground after school on Wednesday 20 January.



Playground access

From now on we will be keeping the front pedestrian gate closed until 8.30am when it will be opened by the teacher on duty. This is because a number of the older children have been arriving early and going straight round to the back playground where they are unsupervised. Children's safety is always our first priority, but we are unable to supervise either playground before 8.30am.
