I hope that you all enjoyed a relaxing Easter break. Here is a brief outline of the topics we will be covering and some helpful points to note.

P.E. - the children will be doing P.E. on a Wednesday afternoon with Mr Ruff who will be teaching Athletics. Please ensure that children's PE kits are brought in on a Monday morning and remain in school all week. All kit must be clearly named, long hair must be tied back and earrings must be removed for PE sessions. On Wednesdays and Fridays the children will be doing swimming. Please ensure that you put sun cream on your child before they arrive in school. If your child has a verucca then they will need to wear a sock from the chemists' as the school is not able to provide this. If your child would like to wear goggles then please can you provide a signed note. Other useful items include deodorant (no sprays), talcum powder and a hairbrush. Please ensure your child does not have any gel in their hair on a swim day as it affects the chemical levels in the pool. We will swim rain or shine so remember a hat or raincoat for children to wear at the side of the pool.

Homework:

- Reading logs Please ensure that your child brings these in on a Monday, so that we can
 fill them in during the week when they do reading with either myself, Mrs Shepherd or
 one of the many parent helpers that we now have.
- Weekly spellings these will be sent home on a Monday and tested the following Monday.
- Homework please sign homework books weekly and indicate how much help/where help
 has been given or if it was simply too easy! This will really help me to gauge the children's
 understanding. Homework will be set on a Friday and will be due in by the following
 Tuesday. The children receive 3 or more dojos for any homework that they do.

Theme for the term - Ancient Egypt

Our topic for this term will be all about Ancient Egypt! We will begin our topic by learning about the history of Ancient Egypt through a timeline before looking at how the pyramids were constructed, the Gods and Goddesses of Ancient Egypt, what daily life was like and the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb by Howard Carter. We have already created a display of the children's homework in the classroom.

Literacy - Here are the main themes we will follow during the term:

Numeracy - Work will always be differentiated to suit the needs of the child.

Fractions
Place value
Half Term
Addition and subtraction
Measure including time
Assessment

Part of the children's maths this year will be taught by Miss Lyons on a Tuesday, who will be covering aspects of geometry and statistics.

Science - In Science this term we will be covering digestion, teeth and food cycles/chains.

Computing - This will be taught by Miss Lyons on a Tuesday. The children will be learning word processing skills and how to create algorithms using the popular Scratch programme.

R.E. - we will continue to teach RE as a whole Y3/4 cohort this term. Our first unit will cover aspects of Hinduism, including the question how and why do Hindus worship at home and in the mandir? After half term, we will be focusing on how signs and symbols are significant in religion.

Art - we are looking forward to Art Week in the second half of this term when we will be creating some fabulous Egyptian-style silk paintings! Throughout the term will be creating some Egyptian themed art work relating to our topic work.

Music - we will continue learning about Samba following on from our rainforest topic.

D&T - we will be designing torches which will be related to our topic work on archaeologists and explorers.

History - This will be linked around our topic on the Ancient Egyptians.

As the weather starts to improve, we hope to do more outdoor learning. Can you please ensure that your child has a sun hat with them in school.
