


use the car park if you have a blue disabled badge.

WOW design a badge competition



The Eco-Council would like to introduce one of the UK's largest art competitions, managed by Living Streets (The Pedestrians' Association), in which they are keen for the whole school to get involved! We are inviting all children to design their own WOW (Walk Once A Week) badge, based on this year's theme, 'Walk the Americas.' From the dramatic landscapes of Canadian national parks, through Brazilian rainforests teeming with life, down to the icy glaciers in Southern Argentina; the Americas have lots on offer. Children from across the school have the opportunity to celebrate the nature, culture and history of these continents by designing a badge that captures a specific feature of this region.

Each class will vote to decide their winner, and the Eco-Council will then select a winner from KS1, lower KS2 and upper KS2. The three overall winning designs will be entered into the Living Streets competition, with a chance to win a WOW trophy and goody bag, as well as a year's supply of WOW resources for the school, up to the value of £500! The 11 winners of the overall competition will be turned into more than 400,000 badges, featuring in next year's WOW challenge.

If anyone is unable to print their own copy of the form, there will be copies available to collect from the School Office.


Smoking / Vaping on School Premises
