We place great importance on the well being of our children. The children learn how to share, be cooperative and tolerant to others, respecting and celebrating differences. Our Personal, Social and Emotional development programme includes developing independence and self worth, making decisions and learning to behave appropriately. Children learn to express themselves and deal with issues of right and wrong. They are able to respond to different cultures and religions.



Learning Environment

Our school has excellent resources as we strive to create a high quality environment for all the children and adults at the school.

St Mary's has nine large classrooms each with outside learning spaces. The children benefit from the excellent ICT provision, large hall/gym and both central and class libraries.

Our imaginative and creative school grounds have been recognised in awards given by South East in Bloom, photographs have been published in 'Creating a Multi-sensory Spiritual Garden in Your School' by Shahne Vickery. The extensive grounds incorporate two hard surfaced playgrounds, an open air stage, an adventure playground and a large playing field. A willow dome, orchard and raised beds enable pupils to gain first hand experience in caring for the environment, whilst a large wildlife area with a pond allows them to participate in pond dipping.

Children are able to use the school's heated swimming pool extensively throughout the summer term.

Creative Curriculum

Foundation Stage – Ages 4 to 5 – Reception Classes Key Stage One – Ages 5 to 7 – Known as Years 1 and 2 Key Stage Two – Ages 7 to 11 – Known as Years 3, 4, 5 and 6

In the Foundation Stage the curriculum is divided into six areas: Knowledge and Understanding of the World, Creative Development, Physical Development, Personal Social & Emotional Development, Communication Language & Literacy and Mathematical Development.

At Key Stage One and Key Stage Two, the children follow programmes of study from the National Curriculum, which cover the subjects of RE, English, Maths, Science, ICT, Technology, Art, History, Geography, Music, PE and Citizenship.

The children learn different skills, gain knowledge and experience which, shapes their attitude and helps develop behavior patterns.

The school, in its teaching, aims to give each child a broad and balanced range of Skillman experiences. Children are generally placed in mixed year groups. The expertise of staff is utilised so that children are gradually exposed to different teaching styles, helping them to become more independent, adaptable and responsible for their own learning. We believe that children will leave the school with high standards in literacy and numeracy and that they will have developed self-confidence and expressive skills in becoming independent learners.

Wider enriched curriculum

The school takes pride in the variety and breadth of clubs available to children throughout the year. Clubs are delivered by staff and outside providers and include exciting activities such as Street Jazz, Judo and Golf.

Key Stage Two pupils have the opportunity to take part in residential trips in both Years 5 and 6. These enable them to spend time away from home promoting independence, push their boundaries and experience different activities such as zip wire, abseiling and climbing.

St Mary's has a strong drama culture with Foundation and Key Stage One performing a Christmas Play, Years 3 and 4 an Easter Play and Years 5 and 6 a Summer Term Production.
