Sculpture - Year 5



Sussex Underwater

We were thrilled to have Paul from Sussex Underwater join us. Paul spoke to the children about the reef at Bognor Regis and what is under the waves. Paul explained how, until April 2021, trawlers were free to operate in the area but since the introduction of the trawler ban, the pressure on the ecosystem has eased, and nature has started to bounce back. The transformation beneath the waves has been amazing! Paul brought along his diving equipment and told the children fascinating facts and stories about the reef's colourful inhabitants.
