**Special Educational Needs** – Classrooms at our school have children with talents, expertise and all sorts of abilities and we pride ourselves on knowing every child. Some of the children have special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) which can affect a child or young person's ability to learn. They can affect their:

- behaviour or ability to socialise, for example they struggle to make friends
- reading and writing, for example because they have dyslexia
- ability to understand things
- concentration levels, for example because they have attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)
- physical ability

Mrs Hatcher is our Special Educational Needs and Disability Coordinator (SENDCo) at school and she can offer support regarding Special Educational Needs. When class teachers or the Senior Leadership Team are sorting out situations at school, sometimes a child with a special educational need may be involved and we ask that parents are understanding about that. If we are permitted, we will share information if this is the case so that parents can fully understand a situation.

**Transition** – As we begin to start the transition to the next classes, we have been thinking about what each year group needs to know. Letters will come out to parents via MCAS on Thursday next week. It would be great if parents use these checklists over the summer holidays to prepare your child for the next year group.


