- Use wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs.
- Use paragraphs to signal change in time, scene action, mood or person.

Themes for the term - 'The World at War' and 'Frozen Kingdom.'

During the first half of term, we will be learning about World War 2. It has been fantastic to see the children's engagement for this theme and superb heliday homework. After half term, we will investigate characteristics and features of Polar Regions, and explore the environmental factors that shape and influence them.

Mental Maths, Arithmetic and problem-solving activities will all be timetabled regularly.

Science: We will study two main themse this term: The Circulatory System and Light. We will be learning about the parts of the circulatory system and their functions, followed by exploring the impact of exercise on the human body and the coreposition and functions of blood. During the second half of term, there will be regular opportunities for practical work to explore concepts in cluding reflection, refraction and the colour spectrum.

Relationship and Health Educatio

Relationships and Health Education is now statutory. This term, we will cover Sex and Relationship Education: 'Healthy Relationships & How a Baby is Made.'

 $\textbf{\textit{Computing:}} \ \ \text{This term the children will develop their skills in the areas of \textit{Coding and E-Safety}.}$

Mathematics

- Use negative numbers in context and calculate intervals across zero.
- Compare and order numbers up to 10,000,000.
- Identify common factors, common multiples and prime numbers.
- Round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy.
- Identify the value of each digit to 3 decimal places.
- Use knowledge of order of operations to carry out calculations involving four operations.
- Multiply 4-digit by 2-digit
- Divide 4-digit by 2-digit
- Add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers.
- Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in the simplest form.
- Divide proper fractions by whole numbers.
- Calculate percentage of whole number.

- Children will have their playtime at 12:15 and then eat their lunch in the hall at 1:35.

- · Log in details will be shared via email.

- One piece of homework completed per week. Choose from: English, Maths, Science and Art/DT.

- Maths: TT Rockstars and Maths with a Mouse little and often!
- By Year 5 and 6, it is imperative that the children know their multiplication and division facts. Quick recall will help them in many areas of their Maths learning this year. Please encourage them to keep practising.

Reading Logs and Spellings



- Reading logs are checked daily by Mrs Bryan and me.
- Children do not need to record every day, but they do need to bring it to school.
- •3 x per week as a minimum.
- Please encourage children to summarise or reflect on their reading. For example: what might happen next?
- Accelerated Reader and MyOn: online platform for reading. Please encourage children to complete the relevant quiz once they have finished their book.
- Weekly spellings are tested on Monday. Spelling books remain in school and word lists will be uploaded to Google Classroom.
