Today is World Mental Health Day and it was lovely to see lots of our children and staff wear something yellow alongside their uniform to raise awareness



















#### Attendance

### ATTENDANCE MATTERS

We know that there is a link between good attendance in school and children who thrive socially, emotionally and academically.





Good attendance and punctuality alllows children to develop friendships, teamwork and communication skills that are important for their future success. Missing school frequently can lead to learning gaps, lower academic performance and difficulty keeping up with peers.

## Learning

#### Maths

Italy Class - On Monday, we looked at the language of 'part' and 'whole' by playing games in the hall. We supported this understanding further through use of stem sentences, e.g. '5 is the whole, 2 is a part and 3 is a part.'







## English / Maths

Italy Class - Today, we read 'Mr Gumpy's Outing'. We represented this ourselves by physically getting into and out of the boat. Each time we added to the boat, we represented this through a 'first, then, now' sentence and also wrote the formal calculation itself.




### Football
