



## Staffing

We have welcomed Stella Castle to the Roosters staff team this week. She has a wealth of experience in childcare and we are delighted to have her join us.




## Inset Day






# Curriculum

## Learning Topics

This half term, UK and Thailand class will be doing a topic called 'Into the Woods' and this links so well with the children starting Forest School sessions. Italy, India and Australia have started learning about their senses with their topic on 'Sensational Senses'. NZ, SL and USA are learning about 'Flow' which links with rivers and a study of the River Arun. Mexico and China are learning about 'Ancient Greece' and it was delightful to see them starting in Greek costumes on the first day back as their superstarter. Year 6 have the theme of 'Frozen Kingdom'. ## Loving House Cup


The children have collected Class Dojo points all week and this week's winners are


