CPD: Standards have significantly improved in PE and children enjoy taking part in PE and sport. The percentage of pupils achieving age expectations in PE in 2025 was 98% at the end of key stage 2 and 90% at the end of key stage 1. This is a significant increase at the end of key stage 1, demonstrating increased teacher confidence in delivering the PE curriculum. Planning is regularly reviewed and lessons are updated and adapted, catering for specific requirements. The positive impact of CPD can be sustained through access to training materials cascaded to new staff, a dedicated and highly experienced PE subject lead and experienced teachers remaining in each year group.

Internal Resources: Extra-curricular opportunities have widened, are embedded and will continue, with additional focus on encouraging disadvantaged and SEND pupils to attend. Accreditations are in place for the Sportsmark (Gold). We have excellent take-up for Bikeability sessions across KS2. EYFS and KS1 pupils are accessing bikes and scooters in school on a daily basis. We will continue with these current initiatives and promote wider engagement. Memberships will continue in order that we can access professional opportunities for our staff and pupils. The resources we have purchased this year, such as the Active Wall, are all aimed at inclusive engagement in physical activity and the children have responded well to these opportunities. We have funded a new adventure playground in the shape of a castle.

External Resources: Children are keen to engage in competitive sporting opportunities as well as chances to try out new sports e.g., Y3 badminton at our local sports centre. The Year 4/5/6 football team as well as Girls Football sessions. We will continue to enter as many competitions as possible and develop events with other local schools through the School Partnership Group. We will continue to focus on those pupils who do not usually take up additional PE and sporting opportunities, e.g., inactive girls and disadvantaged children.
