Father Paul introduced our newest children to Posada today. Posada is a Christmas tradition that reenacts Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. The tradition is named after the Spanish word for "inn" and originates in Hispanic countries as a reenactment of Mary and Joseph searching for shelter. A set of nativity figures travels from one household to another, often with a a story and prayers. Families sign up to host for one night and then pass the figures to the next house - in school we uphold this tradition by passing figures of Mary, Joseph and the donkey from each class and office where they are given and received each day with prayers and kept for 24 hours - we will share photo's of their journey throughout Advent.


