




Curriculum

Learning Science



China class have been investigating different ways of separating materials. We looked at sieving, magnetic force, evaporation and filtration.



Design & Technology



In Brazil, some of the children have been working on making 'sliders' - pictures with moving, or sliding, parts - as part of a DT project. They were understandably very proud of their efforts, as were we. The children in Mexico class have also been learning to sew - they learnt how to thread a needle, running stitch and produced a finish piece of sewing. They should be proud of their efforts!

Forest School


