

## Learning Pancakes



UK and Thailand classes have been enjoying the story 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes'. This high-quality text immerses the children in rich language and engaging storytelling.

China and Mexico classes have been very busy today experiencing a 'taste' of life as a peasant. We cooked cabbage and leek pottage, mashed peas and gingerbread with some surprising taste test results! We then came together and enjoyed watching 'The Sword in the Stone'.



## Science



Year 6 have been completing a range of practical work this term as part of our Science learning on light. Firstly, we explored how light travels and used torches and mirrors to investigate the angles of incidence and reflection. We have also learnt about the history of periscopes and made models to find out how they work. This week, we have investigated how light travels when it passes through transparent materials such as air, water and glass. We discovered how the law of refraction, which occurs when light rays pass through materials with different density, gave the illusion that images had changed their appearance or disappeared altogether!







## Forest School




