Achievements – Well done to **Holly D (SL)** who achieved her certificate for 'Preparatory stage Violin', **Elba S (Ind)** who has been awarded 'Foundation stage violin' and **William C (Chi)** has been awarded Grade 1 Clarinet. Instruments are a challenge to learn so well done for persevering and learning an instrument.

Learning - In year 4 we have been leaning about teeth and digestion this half term. This week we modelled the digestive system using crackers, water, vinegar, a plastic bag and an old pair of tights! The crackers were broken up as our teeth would and water mimicked saliva to allow the crackers to be swallowed, the clear plastic bag represents the stomach which is a large muscular sac that contains hydrochloric acid, it is able to churn the food, mixing it with the acid so that it can be broken down into even smaller molecules. The food is then poured into the tights, this represents the small intestine inside the body. This is where the nutrients from the food we have eaten is absorbed. The small intestine is well adapted for digestion: it has thin walls, making it easy for food molecules to pass through into the blood stream. The last stage of digestion involves the large intestine that absorbs water and any remaining nutrients from the small intestine. Once this has been done the waste products are then excreted from the body as poo!

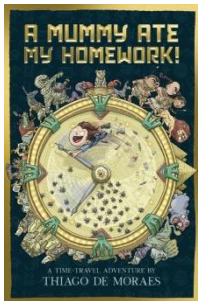
Dear Parents / Carers

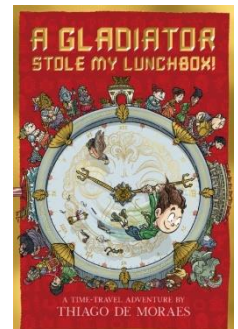
About *A Gladiator Stole my Lunchbox*
