

# **Reception Autumn Term 1**

### Welcome to Reception!

What a fantastic start to the new school year. The children have settled very well and are enjoying telling us about themselves, their families and what they are looking forward to at school.

This term the children will learn to work together and be part of a team. Topics are chosen based on the children's interests and linked to the Autumn and Harvest.

Links to the EYFS Curriculum

- Understanding the World: Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change.
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development: Talk to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions.

#### Expressive Arts and Design

Our Creative Area provides opportunities for the children to create pictures of events, people and objects, through using different colours and shapes. The children will be taught how to use different tools to develop their fine motor skills.

Links to the EYFS Curriculum:

- Create simple representations of events, people and objects.
- Chooses particular colours to use for a purpose.

### Mathematics

We try to teach the majority of our Maths through stories. This half term we will be sharing books which will develop counting skills, number consolidation to 5 and Mathematical vocabulary.

Links to the EYFS Curriculum:

• Counts objects to 10, and beginning to count beyond 10.

• Selects the correct numeral to represent 1 to 10 objects. We will also begin to learn about shapes in our environment, their names and their properties.

• Beginning to use mathematical names for 'flat' 2D shapes, and mathematical terms to describe shapes.

# <u>The Garden</u>

### **Forest School**

Over the year U.K. and Austria class will take part in outdoor learning sessions. Together we will make campfires, build shelters, make mud-pies and use natural materials and tools to create crafts and mini-beast homes. The children will be asked to wear old clothes and boots each week - our first session starts on **Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October**.

### Book bags

Book bags need to be brought into school every day. Children will be choosing books from the class book box and a reading scheme book. It is very important that you spare a few minutes every day to hear your child read and make an appropriate comment in their reading log. Please note these books are for sharing; we are not expecting your child to read them to you, just find a nice quiet time to relax and enjoy the book together.

An exciting aspect of our work in the Foundation Stage is that we work from the children's interests. This means we are flexible in our planning and the children have an opportunity to choose the direction a theme takes. It also offers them flexibility on how long we spend on each theme. As the children are directly involved in our planning they get so much more out of their time at school so we thank you in advance for supporting our strange topics and requests!

The most important person in your child's life is you! Parents have a fundamental role to play in education too. If any of you would like to come into school at any time to help in class by reading to the children, cooking or doing art and craft activities you would be most welcome.
