Don't connect to public Wi-Fi hotspots when doing anything confidential online. They may not be secure, and they may even be fraudulent. Always beware of people looking over your shoulder when you're entering private information on a computer, mobile device or ATM. Arrange for paperless bills and statements instead of printed ones. File sensitive documents securely, and shred those you no longer need – preferably with a cross-cut shredder. Get regular credit reports to check if anybody has taken out finance in your name.

Hopefully more will appear but it does rely on willing volunteers and some commitment to monitor the bins, sort through the refuse, package and send off. Now Sandra at Dyke Farm Shop has kindly offered her premises for an initial 2 bins which are now in place. See the flyer pdf to left which details what can be recycled there. It is hoped to have other locations and as the local scheme grows it may be possible to have other single use plastic. 24/7 SINGLE USE PLASTIC DROP OFF BilliGreen, an environmental group in Billingshurst have supplied some Council bins for local people to recycle specific hard to recycle plastics. The Unitarian Church can be accessed on foot from the high street or by car via Lakers Meadows near the library. This recycling point is expanding rapidly there are now three bins taking six different items, two in each bin. The bins are: 1) Crisp and savoury snack packets (keep them flat) and beauty products 2) Biscuit, cake and cracker wrappers and Ella baby food pouches and snacks 3) Plastic bottle tops (Types 2&4 imprinted on tops) and cheese wrapping
