
IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YEAR 6 TRANSFER TO SECONDARY SCHOOL

Applications made after the deadline are not considered until after all on time applications and the outcome of the application may be affected if it is late. Applying after the deadline will significantly affect your chance of getting a place at your preferred school.


