### - GIANT LIST OF IDEAS FOR BEING HOME WITH CHILDREN

(for: actual quarantine, school closures, weekend social distancing, anytime!)

- Have each child pick a topic they'd like to learn about and spend 30 mins each day on that topic
- Spend one day reading every single picture book you have in the house
- Read with your child
- Go through all the old mail laying around (ok, that one's not for children although they do enjoy helping tear stuff up)
- Bake something every day (read the recipe talk about measuring ingredients and make together)
- Have each child write a letter and/or emails to a different friend or family member each day
- Use all of your building toys on one giant structure
- Wash your hands.
- Races of various kinds in the backyard (hopping on one foot, crabwalk, walking backwards, etc.)
- Try stop motion animation with playdough and your phone
- Facetime grandparents a lot
- Inventory the plants & wildlife (from bugs on up) in your garden.
- Learn the parts of plants/flowers & how they function (bonus if you learn the Latin names).
- If you aren't too squeamish & have a spare clear shoebox size tote or 5-10 gallon tank, catch some woodlouse & observe them write a short story & illustrate it.
- Learn how to do simple book binding.
- Make paper (from your old mail!)
- Have the children help with housework/gardening in between playing games outside. They're little, but they like getting dirty and ''working'' in the gardens.
- <u>GoNoodle!</u> Great for guided movement, relaxation, etc.
