

The aim is to encourage schools, families and young people to take a walk in the park, surrounding countryside or school grounds, carry out litter pick up, analyse the results, action plan around eliminating litter and then get creative with a piece of art. We hope they will help us create great places for humans, wildlife, marine life and reduce the effects of climate change on our great Planet!

Roadshow sessions can include:

Nicola Peel is offering the talk Nature as Teacher and Inventor. Highlighting the fascinating subject of biomimicry and showing an interconnected understanding of how life works and ultimately where we fit in. It is a practice that learns from and mimics the strategies used by species alive today. After billions of years of research and development, failures are fossils, and what remains hold the secret to our survival. The talk covers architecture and materials design, fashion and communication and is a fascinating new way to learn from nature and lessen our impact on the planet we all call home.

<u>Carrie Cort is offering Kinder Clothes assemblies and lessons</u> - learn about the impact of the fast fashion industry and ways we can be kinder with the clothes we wear. Games around water use, clothes miles, natural and synthetic materials, chemical and natural dyes, meaning of organic in relation to clothes with a big focus on the solutions to this big problem. The session can focus on school uniform and how we can green up our schools.

<u>Or Growing Communities session</u> – name the different seasons, understand what seasonal food means, benefit of growing own food. Name: 2 pollinators, 2 pollinator friendly spices and aromatic plants (we will be growing common ones like: sage, oregano, basil, mints and thyme). Planting activities from the float!
