We are looking for parents/carers to join a parent co-production session focused on the educational support for pupils with SEN in West Sussex.

The session will consider all stages of support i.e. SEN Support, EHC needs assessment and monitoring and review of EHCPs.

We would like to work with parents/carers who represent all these different stages and are able to tell us what has worked well for their child/young people, what could have worked better and what you think might improve things for you/other families.

We are seeking a cross-section of families with children/young people of varying ages and experiences.

The session will be conducted by an impartial SEN consultant and will be relaxed and informal.

The sessions will be held in 4 different venues across West Sussex during the Autumn Term 2021.
