

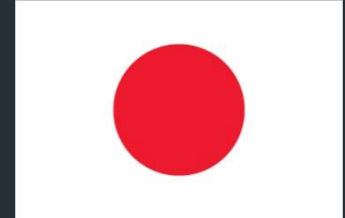

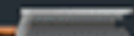
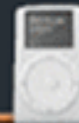

Spellings: Monday (statutory lists of spellings for new NC and occurring in SATs). Spelling books will remain in school and word lists will be emailed to parents each week.

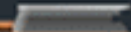
Maths: TT Rockstars and MyMaths – little and often!

- ▶ **Class Certificates – Star of the Week, Dojo Champion**



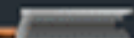
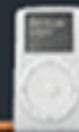
Behaviour Policy

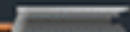
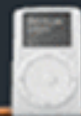
Parents' Evenings: to take place virtually this year
