Splash – The children and staff love SPLASH coming to visit us and the key message from their worship today was one person cannot change the world, but YOU can change the world for one person. The children focussed on the story of the Good Samaritan and children helped to act out.



Ash Wednesday Eucharist – We are having our Ash Wednesday service on Wednesday 26th February at 9am. If you would like to join us for this then everyone is welcome. Last year Father Paul modelled the ash crosses on the children's heads and this year the children will be given the opportunity to have an ash cross at the end of the service.

World Book Day - Thursday 5th March. We are celebrating this to raise awareness of the importance of reading and to develop children's love of books. We are inviting the children to dress up as a book character of their choice and we would like them to bring in a favourite book to share with someone else (this does not need to link to their costume).



Steyning Book Shop will be visiting the school on **Friday 13th March** from 2pm for the children. The parents are invited to look at the books in the school hall from 3pm. As a school, we do get commission from the sale of these books, which in turn allows us to purchase new books for our library. The children will be receiving a £1.00 book voucher, which can be used towards a book of their choice. Books start from £1.00 and the children will receive their vouchers on the day.

They also had great fun on the slack line and tyre swing.


