Make a collage of your favourite superheroes using a range of different materials.



If you could have a super power what would it be? Would you be able to fly? Become invisible? See through buildings? Write about an adventure you might have.



Who is your hero? Bring in a picture of them and write a few sentences to explain why you chose them.



Read a newspaper or watch the news with a parent and see if you can spot any stories of people doing heroic things.



Read for 10 minutes at least four times a week. Practise your number bonds to 10, 20 and 100.



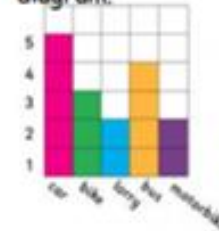
Take photographs or draw pictures of yourself being a 'superkid' at home. Maybe tidying your room or helping wash the dishes.
