

Half term – We hope you all had a lovely half term and managed to spend some time enjoying the holidays.

INSET day – The staff had a purposeful inset day on Friday 14th February. It was a day for the staff to deepen their understanding of the curriculum and be clear about intent, implementation and impact of the new curriculum. It also gave us time to develop our planning to ensure we are deepening the children's experiences with us and aid the teaching and the children's learning.

25 Day Attendance Challenge - Monday 2nd March – 3rd April 2020 - As one of one of our OFSTED action points, we need to improve our attendance throughout the school. We are launching an 'Attendance Challenge' starting on Monday 2nd March and will run until the end of term. After the Easter break we will be increasing this to a '30 Day Attendance challenge'.

Reports – Parents evenings have now gone live. If you would like an appointment, please log on and book! As a school, we are required to report to parents once a year in written format. Reports will be coming home to the majority of parents on Friday 13th March and then Parents Evenings will be on Tuesday 17th and Thursday 19th March. The window for parents evening will open on the 24th February at 8am through e-schools via the school website. Usborne Books will be attending both parent's evenings.

Staffing TA appointment - We have appointed a teaching assistant, Miss Barnes – she has a wealth of experience and will joining us shortly.

Vine leaf – Well done to Caitlin T (Thailand) for 'Peace'. She is learning to find peace around difficult situation. She is learning to be okay with how things are – then doing better in class and Elani (India) for 'Generosity and humility for giving her PE to Children in India Class on different occasions.

Kindness Shield – Well done to **Elba (France)** who has been awarded the 'Kindness Shield' for February. 'Elba always considers the needs of others and is extremely loving, caring, and kind.'

Launch of Fairtrade – To mark Fairtrade Fortnight, Pulborough Fairtrade Group has organised a Smoothie Bike event to be held at The Greenhouse, opposite Coughtrey's Butchers, Saturday 29th February 10am – 2pm. Please come along, 'pedal your own delicious banana smoothie', and support Fairtrade at the same time. The cost is only 50p or FREE if you bring your own cup! There will also be yummy Fairtrade cakes for you to try. Poster attached.



We started Fairtrade Fortnight with a whole school assembly to remind everyone of the aims and work of Fairtrade. The children looked at the supply chain and saw that the supermarket, the ripener, the shipper, the exporter and the farmer all need to be paid for their work. By the time everyone else in the supply chain has been paid, the farmers sometimes do not receive a fair amount of money for their hard work. Fairtrade aims to ensure that the farmers receive a fair price for the vital role that they play. In addition to this, the Fairtrade Premium is an extra sum of money, which can be spent on anything that can benefit the farmers, their families and the community.

The Fairtrade prefects, along with a team of actors from Japan and Sierra Leone classes, prepared a drama titled 'Protecting People and Planet' to explain the threats to the rainforest and show how human actions impact on this environment. They showed how Fairtrade is important and demonstrated how we can protect the rainforests by ensuring that those that live and work there are paid fairly.

In class worship this week, we watched the film 'Guardians of the Rainforest,' which taught us about forest friendly farming technique used by the Ngoleagorbu cocoa farmers in the Gola rainforest in Sierra Leone. Here are some of the children's comments and reflections:

Robyn: It made me realise how easy our lives were. It isn't fair that they have to walk such a long way for clean drinking water.

Martina: They have to work a lot harder for the things we take for granted. It made me realise how lucky we are.

Benedict: I learnt that many children are not able to go to secondary school in Sierra Leone as it is very expensive and they often have to travel to another town. Fairtrade helps more people to attend secondary school and college.

Cricket - On Thursday 27th February, we travelled to Millais School for Girls in Horsham for a six a side indoor cricket competition. **Erin, Izzy, Holly M, Evie, Niamh A and Amy H** played four games and learnt lots about the game. They played well as a team and represented the school with a team spirit and fantastic behaviour. Well done girls!

Highway Code 244 DO NOT stop or park

near a school entrance

- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank
- on the approach to a level crossing/tramway crossing
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- near the brow of a hill or hump bridge
- opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where you would force other traffic to enter a tram lane
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend
- where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities except when forced to do so by stationary traffic.

You **MUST NOT** park partially or wholly on the pavement unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs.


