Welcome back! I hope that you have all had a wonderful summer holiday and are looking forward to the new term ahead. Here is a brief outline of the topics we will be covering and some helpful points to note.

Sierra Leone Class will be visiting Lodge Hill for two activity days later in the term. We are awaiting final confirmation of the dates that these sessions will be taking place and further information will follow.

# <u>PE:</u>

Our PE lessons this term are on Mondays and Fridays. Gymnastics will be on Monday afternoons and Games will be on Friday mornings. Games will be delivered by specialist coaching staff from Albion Football, and will take place outside, weather permitting. Children should have t-shirts, shorts, outdoor shoes, long trousers and a jumper or tracksuit for outdoors in their PE kits. Please ensure that children's PE kits are brought in on a Monday morning and remain in school all week. All kit should be clearly named, long hair tied back and earrings must be removed for PE sessions. As PE is a statutory part of the curriculum, we will require a written note if your child is unable to take part in a lesson.

# Homework:

- Reading logs: Please ensure you listen to, or monitor, your child reading at least three times per week and this is signed and dated. This will form an important part of my assessment for reading, and is a key dialogue between home and school. Reading logs will be collected on Mondays but should be in school every day.
- Weekly spellings will be sent home on a Monday and tested the following Monday. Each week's spellings will include a particular spelling pattern and some of the Year 4 common exception words.
- Homework: The new format of homework introduced last year received very positive feedback so will be continued this year. The children will be given a grid containing Literacy, Maths, Science and Topic activities in their homework books. We would like each child to complete six homework tasks in the first half of term and six homework tasks in the second half of term. The children can choose from any of the activities in the grid, however, their choices must include at least two Literacy tasks and two Maths tasks each half term. Further details have been provided in a letter in your child's homework book.
- Please sign your child's homework book weekly to indicate how much help/where help has been given and ensure that it is returned to school each Thursday.

# Theme for the term - Rumble in the Jungle:

We are looking forward to beginning this term's fantastic topic in which the children will be learning all about the rainforest! We will begin our learning journey by decorating our classrooms with a variety of rainforest plants and creatures to inspire our learning. Much of our literacy and geography work will be centred around this exciting theme where we will be learning about issues such as deforestation and how to protect rainforest environments.

# <u>Literacy:</u>

Here are the main themes we will follow during the term:

- Information texts
- Stories which raise issues/dilemmas
- Persuasive texts
- Stories from other cultures

# Numeracy:

Work will always be differentiated to suit the needs of the child.

- Place Value
- Addition
- Subtraction including money
- Time
- Multiplication and Area
- Division including money
- Fractions

#### Science:

Our Science topic for this term is 'Living Things and their Habitats.' This will be closely linked to our Rainforest theme and will include learning more about the characteristics of living things and how they can be classified. We will also investigate the impact that environmental changes can have on living things.

# <u>RE:</u>

Mrs Martin-Wells and I will be team teaching RE lessons this year on Thursday mornings. The children will be exploring the themes of Creation, Incarnation and Sikhism.

#### Computing:

This term the children will continue to develop their knowledge of programming, using Scratch. They will be developing their problem solving skills and testing, debugging and evaluating programs. We will also be focussing on e-Safety, where we will discuss how to use technology appropriately and the importance of keeping safe online.

#### Geography:

We will begin by locating rainforest environments and describing their climates and physical features. We will then be looking at the different layers of the rainforest and understanding the importance of rainforest resources.

#### Art and DT:

Art will be based on Henri Rousseau and in DT we will be making headdresses inspired by the Brazilian carnivals.

#### <u>Music:</u>

The children are very fortunate to have the opportunity to participate in Samba this term as part of the Music enrichment program! This will be taught by Mrs Eames, a specialist Music teacher, who will visit the school on Wednesday mornings.

#### MFL:

Miss Bell will continue to teach Spanish to the children. This will take place during my PPA time on Friday mornings.
