<u>Just Enough</u> – The charity 'Just Enough' are regular visitors to our school and we love seeing them. Thank you for Just Enough for coming to visit us and tackling some PSCHE issues around inclusion and anti-racism with Year 1,2, 5 and 6. The Year 1 and 2 children made some interesting comments such as; I loved playing with the playdough, I was making people. People are all different, 'We learned that it's not about who you are but about where you are from and how special you are', 'I loved the blind folding experiment and we had to guess who that person was. They talked about how different you feel about people when you can see them' and 'we learned about how we are all different and that is a good thing.'







**TT Rock Stars** – The bug has hit and lots of children are rehearsing their times tables through TT Rock Stars. This week the leader board winners are 1<sup>st</sup> place -Rachel (Mexico), 2<sup>nd</sup> place Buddy (China) and 3<sup>rd</sup> place Amelia (China). Overall Sierra Leone class are in the lead. The walking bus has a great team of volunteers that walk daily, rain or shine. There are a number of children from different year groups and classes that join us, with an average of 15-20 children daily, sometimes more! A member of staff joins us daily - Mrs Rashleigh joins us on Mondays, Mrs Mitchell Tuesday to Thursday and Mrs Callendar on a Friday. You don't have to drop and leave your children with us, you are more than welcome to join us on the walk. If your children walk on a regular basis they are able to earn walking bus badges. We look forward to welcoming more people on the bus this year.

William Orrell article – Walking Bus – On the 10th January, I walked with the Walking Bus to see how they do things there. I walked from my house to Pulborough Social Club where they started. I asked a couple of people what they thought of the Walking Bus. They gave me some good adjectives like 'fun' and so I thought it was worthy of metaphors and they gave me 'it is like riding a unicorn'. I felt very secure whilst walking across the field and they blocked the road so that we could all cross. I also liked the flashy yellow jackets. When we got to school we took off our jackets and the KS1 students stayed at the hut and the KS2 students went off to the back playground.

**Super starters: Superhero Day** – Monday saw lots of superheroes arrive in school and they looked fantastic and really got into character. This was a brilliant super starter to get the children involved in their learning. We are looking forward to seeing the learning that comes out of this inspiring theme.







**Staff training** - The staff have been reviewing our progress towards targets on our School Improvement Plan and we continued the focus on Maths this week where we learnt about bar methods. This is a visual way of teaching Maths and getting the children to understand word problems. It was fantastic and inspiring for the staff. You will begin to see this in their Maths books.

**Reading Challenge** – I have loved being in classes this week and listening to the children talking about the range of texts that they are reading and how inspired they have been. Reading is so important for children's development so please support the challenges.

**Tea and Chat sessions** – We have had one reply to the tea and chat sessions. We will see if anymore come through and then we can respond accordingly.

**Greek Day** – Then on Wednesday we watched as many children arrived in the most exquisite Greek costumes. The day really immersed them in the life of the Greeks with a banquet, Olympic sports, art and culture. Thank you to Mrs Lui, Mrs James, Mrs Smith and Ms Grassie for pitching in with the activities.







## Poster for Peace

## **Peace Art Competition 2019**

Your child is participating in the Lions Poster for Peace contest.

The Billingshurst & District Lions Club is sponsoring the contest at the 10 local Primary Schools in the Billingshurst area and, by entering this competition, your child will be joining many others in their vision of world peace. This contest is open to children aged 8, 9 and 10 by 31<sup>st</sup> August 2019, and gives an opportunity for a discussion on the true importance of peace.

### **Prizes**

The best poster in each class will receive a winner's certificate and prize - and will be submitted to the UK Lions South East regional competition, too. The runner-up in each class will receive a certificate of commendation.

The South East District Prize Winner will receive an award to keep and tokens to the value of £30 for Art products. Their school will receive an Award to keep for the year and a cheque for £100. The District runner-up will receive £25 of tokens and their school a cheque for £50. The District 3<sup>rd</sup> prize winner will receive £20 of tokens and their school a cheque for £50.

### Rules

The theme is 'Kindness Matters'. Art work must be no larger than A3 and no smaller than A4. The name, class, year group and school of the child must be written on the back of the poster.

Artwork should be done on flexible material, so that it can be rolled for posting: Don't fold it! Do not laminate artwork; however, fixative spray may be used.

Artwork must be original and the effort of just one child. Children entering the competition must be aged 8 to 10 years old on 31 August 2019 (ie currently in Years 3, 4 & 5).

The deadline for entries is Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup> of March 2019: The Lions will collect all entries from the School on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> of March.

### **Judging**

The posters will be judged by local sculptor and professional artist Mena Forte. She was for many years a school art teacher and is now a professional artist who lives and works in Tismans Common.

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Lions Clubs International is the world's largest service club organisation, with more than 1.4 million members in 205 countries. The Lions have a strong commitment to community service and helping youth throughout the world. The Billingshurst Lions raise money via their bookshop in Jengers Mead and the Christmas carols collection each December. Since its founding in 1973, the Billingshurst Lions have raised and donated well in excess of £600,000, most of which was donated to local causes.

3<sup>rd</sup> - a £20 art voucher + £50 for the School
