





On the 28th of November, USA and Sierra Leone performed a samba concert for their parents. It kicked off with some exercises to get ready for the drumming they were going to do. Then they introduced us to the instruments, such as surdo drums, repinique drums, riosa drums, agogo pasos and tamborims. I felt a little bit ill when listening to their instruments. After a long round of drums, it was time for the parents to leave.





Medicines – For school to administer medication, it <u>must</u> be prescribed by a GP, and for a minimum of 4 x doses a day for us to be able at administer during the school day. If the medicine is prescribed for 3 x a day then it must be given at home as follows: before school, after school and at bed time. This is in line with our school policy (directed by Managing Medicines in School by WSCC).

If your child is prescribed medication for $4 \times a$ day then you must bring the medication in in its original container with the GP printed label, and a form must be completed at the School Office; the child must not bring in medication in without an adult. Many thanks for your cooperation with this.


