Christian Values – We are looking at friendship, generosity and thankfulness over this half term.

Anti-bullying – We work hard to deal with incidents that crop up at school. We have an Anti-Bullying Policy on our school website for parents to reference with how we manage incidents within school. As children learn to work together there can be incidents that need support to work through. We take a 'no blame' approach and work on restorative justice within our anti-bullying. We will sit with the child/ren concerned and find out what is happening for them, and then we will sit with the other children concerned and work through what has happened. We have other things in school to support the child such as a pupil-safeguarding booklet, worry cards, worry box and we complete an annual questionnaire with the children about safeguarding in the school, as we are always keen to improve our practises if needed. Year 5 and Year 6 have been thinking about Peer on Peer abuse in their Relationships and Health Education unit, how they can deal with these situations, and how we, as a school keep them safe and what they can do. 

About Tom Vaughan


