Thank you to everyone for giving me such a warm welcome back to school. It really is lovely to be back and I know that we have lots of exciting things planned for the coming term. You will know by now that I will be leaving St Mary's in the not too distant future. I have decided that much as I love the school and my role of Headteacher is probably the most rewarding I have ever had, the time has come for me to take on new and different challenges.

It is lovely to see how well the children have settled into their new classes and how much excellent learning is going on across the whole school. One of the biggest changes will have been for children moving from Year Two into Year Three as this signifies the move from Key Stage One to Key Stage Two. At this stage it is important that we encourage and enable them to become more independent. Therefore could I please ask that parents do not bring children all the way around to the Key Stage Two playground in the mornings. Children should be able to walk around on their own. Likewise, there is no need for them to come into school to put their things away until the whistle is blown.

Please also bear in mind that whilst we like to have an open door policy teachers are particularly busy first thing in the morning. It would be extremely helpful if you could either leave a message at the office or send your child in with a note for the class teacher

Year 5 residential – Many of the Y5 children are off to Marchant's Hill in Hindhead for a week of activities. This includes zip wire, archery, fencing, climbing, abseiling, giant swing, aeroball to name but a few. We are hoping for the weather to continue for them and we will be thinking of them on their adventure.


