Teachers' note: Enlarge the page to A3 and copy it onto card. This sheet offers a variety of opportunities for using the numbers 0–10 (see Notes on the activities, page 10). The children could work in pairs to quiz each other, covering either the digit(s) or the word. For the extension activity the children should work in pairs, taking turns to invent phone numbers and saying the numbers one digit at a time.



Teachers' note: In this activity the children practise different forms of greeting according to the time of day. Point out that Buenas noches can mean both 'Good evening' and 'Good night' depending on the circumstances. In the extension activity the children should complete the picture by showing what time of day it is through the window and add the two speakers under the speech bubbles.

Translation: Colours. Colour the parrot. • Find the colours in the wordsearch.

Teachers' note: On this sheet the children learn the Spanish names for colours, recognise their written form and match the name to the colour in a practical colouring activity. They should use a dictionary to find any colours they do not know. It may be helpful to enlarge the page for those children who tackle the extension activity.
