Thank you to all those children who took the time to participate. In addition to this, St Mary's children's art work filled the church in the form of an art gallery. There were so many positive comments about the high standard of work. Thank you to the staff and PTA of the school who ran a stall with the hampers and bottle tombola. The PTA raised about £720 and the Year 6 raised £110 is going towards the Big Top. Year 6 children were also present at the Harvest Fayre fundraising for the Big Top with decorating biscuits. They showed great independence with this task and they were so encouraging towards the younger children as well as showing the Christian values of friendship, compassion and helpfulness. Thank you to those Year 6 children who gave up their time.



Little Explorer news - This week we have started to explore Autumn and have been sorting conkers of different sizes. We have been using apparatus to measure different amounts and sorting accordingly. We have had a visit from Boogie Beats where we learnt about the way different animals move and listened to a jungle story re-creating the actions and scenes. In fun phonics we made shakers with different shaped pasta in to hear how different sounds are made. The school has kindly allocated an area on the field and we are in the process of securing it by the kind help of Shelley the builder. We aim to provide a lovely range of outdoor activities and resources for the Early Years children to explore, we warmly invite reception children to join us.

Meet The Teacher – The hall was packed with parents and it was great to see so many faces and supporting the teachers with their new classes. It was important to introduce the staff team for this year and to talk about our school priorities. We are due an OFSTED at some point in this academic year and so raising attendance, progress across the school and engagement of all children but especially the boys is something all the staff are committed to improving. We are a school team and parents need to be aware of our priorities and how we want to move the school forward. In addition to this, it is important that we celebrate our successes and we have been so fortunate to have the new Early Years and Key Stage One department refurbished making this a wonderful learning environment. We have also had the hall floor replaced. During the year we are hoping to make investments in the library through grants and also we are looking at the sustainability of the swimming pool. If you missed this and would like a copy of the presentation done by the class teacher, then please ask them directly.

School Council – The school council are being very proactive this year and they would like to hold a second hand toy sale/swap shop for the children and to raise money for two of our chosen charities; Family Support Workers and Chestnut Tree House. Children who wish to donate an old toy **can bring them to school on the 5th October 2018**. After school the children and parents are invited to come and purchase a second hand toy from the selection donated and prices will range from 50p upwards. Children will be able to recycle their old toys giving others an opportunity to enjoy them whilst raising money for the charities. Any left-over toys will be donated to the charities and we ask that you ensure toys and games donated are in good working order.

Stone Age days - Ireland and New Zealand class: A huge thank you to Green Caterpillar for running these super starter days with the Year 3 children. It gave the children an opportunity to really explore what it would have been like in the Stone Age with fires, tools and camps.

Admissions Policy

- Spaces will be accessible to all sections of the community.
- Spaces will be allocated as follow:
 - 1st priority: pupils from St Mary's C of E (Aided) Primary School with siblings already attending Jiminy's;
 - 2nd priority: other pupils from St Mary's C of E (Aided) Primary School;
- Registration forms and payment need to be received at least five working days prior to the start of the Holiday Club.
- A Child may only attend once you have received a confirmation letter.
- We promote equality of opportunity for all children without any discrimination on the grounds of sex, race, religion, colour, creed, marital status, ethnic or national origin, or political belief. We recognise that parents are young children's first educators and welcome their involvement.
- Our aim is that each child should be recognised and appreciated; each child have access to all activities, regardless of ability; gender, ability, race, colour, background, origins.
- The criteria are set out with full commitment to Equal Opportunities. They are also to be read in conjunction with 'conditions of registration' that parents/guardians must read and sign before their child is admitted to Jiminy's.
- Detailed policies and procedures are available to everyone at all times.

Conditions of Registration

- You must inform us by 8am via text or phone should your child be absent.
- Children who are collected late (after 3.30pm) will incur a late collection charge of £1 per minute. Money collected from late collection will be divided between the staff that have stayed beyond their contracted hours.
- No refund will be offered for non - attendance.
- Should your child be unwell he/she may be sent home.
- Your child may not be able to attend Jiminy's if he/she has certain illnesses.
- You are required to inform us as soon as any contact details change.
- Concerns and complaints: Please discuss any concerns or complaints with the manager or supervisor. Should the matter not be resolved to your satisfaction, you may contact OFSTED directly.
- You must inform Jiminy's in advance if someone other than the named person will be collecting your child. Your child will not be released otherwise.
- At least **two weeks'** written notice is required if you wish to reduce the number of sessions or give notice.
- We reserve the right to refuse a registration.
- We reserve the right to cancel a registration without notice should an adult or child's behaviour is aggressive, abusive, inappropriate or unacceptable.
- We reserve the right to make any adjustments with short notice.
- By signing the registration form, you agree to all of the conditions of registration.

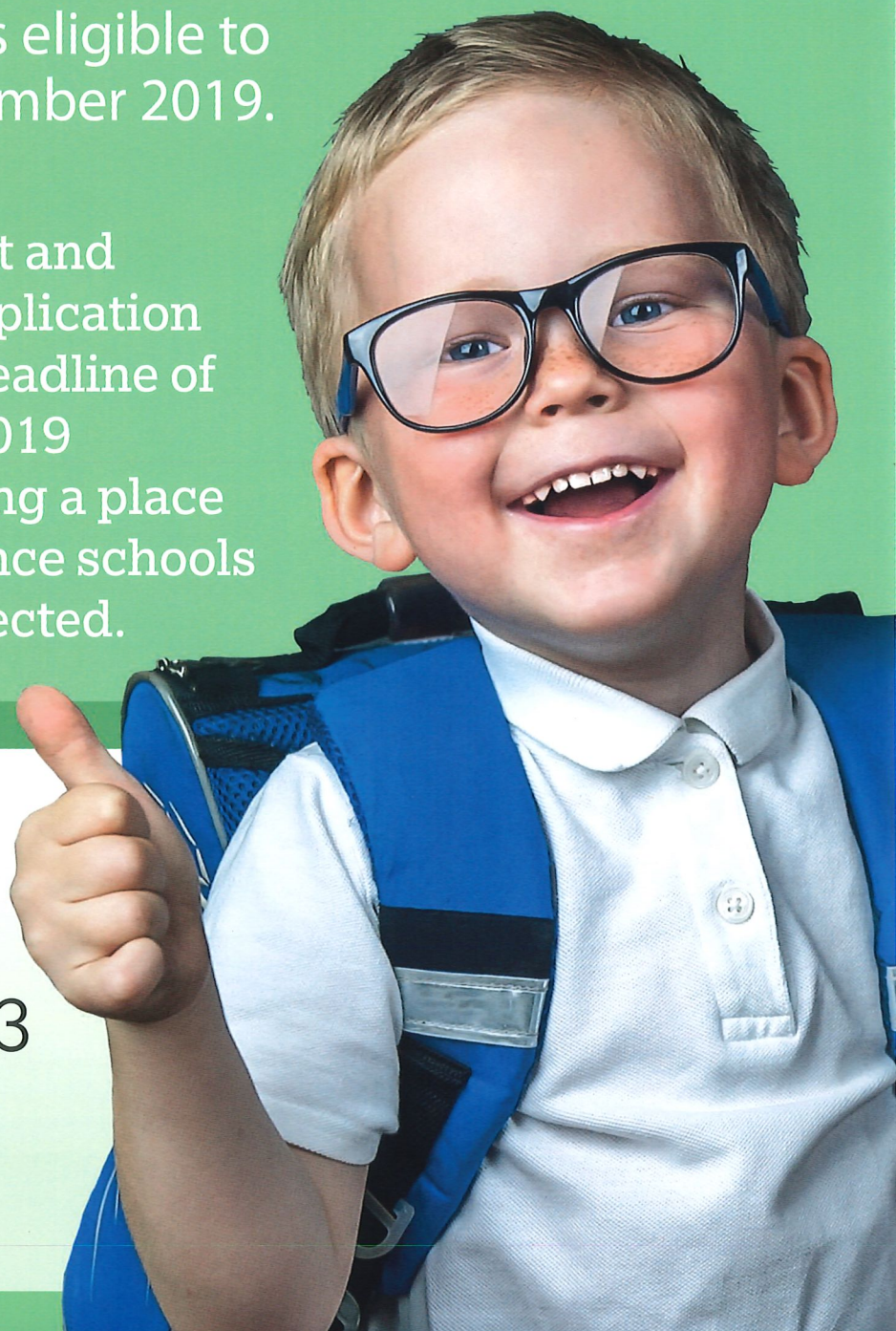

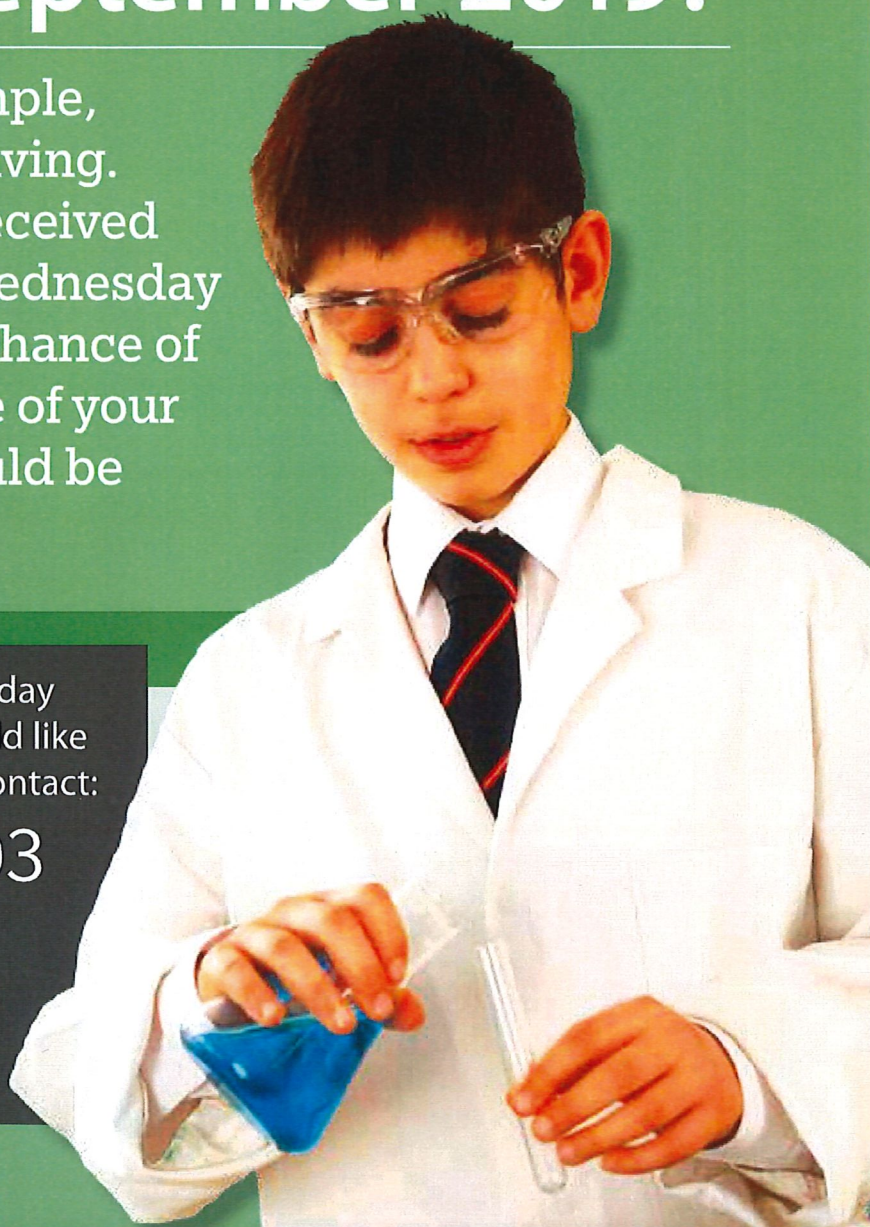


