Miss Bell will be teaching Spanish in Key Stage Two, Brighton and Hove will be teaching Games in Key Stage Two and Miss Dunstall will be teaching in Key Stage One and Early Years to cover PPA cover (Planning, Preparation and Assessment as teachers are entitled to this). Miss Wilkins will be leading the Special Educational Needs in the afternoons and Miss Gorecka will be having her Deputy Head time in the mornings and monitoring the Teaching and Learning with myself.

Office – Mrs Lees (School Business Manager), Mrs Gabriel (School Secretary), Mrs Russell (Receptionist), Mrs Andrews (Bursar) and Mrs Hancock (Admin Assistant) and Miss Elliott is Premises Manager.

Routines – We will spend the first few weeks embedding routines and the drop off and pick up are an important part of this:

Early Years /Key Stage One - We would ask that all children line up in the morning out on the playground when the whistle goes at 8.45am. The teachers have their lessons to prepare in the morning and so children should not be taken to the classroom. If you require before school care then you can book on to Early Birds. The teachers will come and collect the children from the playground so that we can establish a routine and make them independent in putting their belongings away.

Key Stage Two – The playground is supervised from 8.30am and children should come around and socialise with their friends before the whistle goes at 8.45am. Please do not drop the children into the classroom. If you need to speak to a teacher then you can leave a note with the office staff. If your child has a difficulty in the morning with separation anxiety then please come and talk to Miss Wilkins (SENDCo), Miss Gorecka (DHT) or myself and we can arrange a supervised drop off elsewhere so we know they are safe.

Sian Elliott (Premises Manager) will be on the gate and will lock the gate at 8.50am so that the premises is secure.

At the end of the day, the teachers will bring the children out to the playground. Early collection can not happen unless you have a letter from a doctor or hospital or appointment that you are attending. School finishes at 3.15pm. If you find the playground difficult socially then we can arrange a later pick up.

They are available if you would like to speak to any one of them. Please let me know.

Vine leaves – Well done to **Riley G** and **Alfie R** that have been awarded a vine leaf for compassion. They gave up their time to help reassure and care for a Year 1 child who was distressed. Thank you

Wonderful news – We are delighted to announce that Miss Bell and her partner are expecting their second child at the beginning of 2020. Congratulations to them.

Meet The Teacher – **This is on Wednesday 26th September at 6pm.** Please come and meet the staff in the main hall, there will be a quick talk with some information about the School Improvement priorities and then off to classrooms to meet with the teachers and find out more about what the children will be doing this year. This is not an individual parents evening but is just information for your child's class. There is a parents evening planned for 13th November where parents can meet with the teacher to find out how the year has started and the child's tracking data can be discussed. This is in response to parent questionnaires who felt this would be beneficial.

Non school uniform day – back to it already and we are preparing for the village **Harvest Fayre on Saturday 28th September** – there will be a non uniform day on **Friday 13th September** in return for a Tombola prize i.e. Sweets/chocolate or a bottle for the adult tombola.

Little Explorers have had a great start to the new term, the children have settled back into nursery really well and we have welcomed some new friends too.

The children have had fun in the garden playing on the slide, digging in the sand and riding around on the cars. Inside they've enjoyed exploring the light table, playing with the dollies in the home corner and making a huge train track.

With so many children moving up to big school we do have some spaces available at Little Explorers Pulborough but they are filling up fast so if there are any parents looking for a place please contact us for further information.

Attendance – Just a reminder that all children must be in school regularly and consistently. Even if they are 4, they need to attend school everyday.

Holiday requests – We still can't get our attendance in line or above national and so we will focussing on attendance. **No holiday will be authorised** and with absences over five days we will be following the guidance from West Sussex County Council about fining.


- Headteachers may not grant absence for holidays during term time – ‘any application for leave must be in exceptional circumstances and the Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave’.
- If a family choose to take their child/children out of school for a holiday they may be subject to a Fixed Penalty Notice. If unauthorised absences reach 10 sessions (a session is half a day so 10 sessions is equal to 5 days) Holidays of any length will not be authorised except in exceptional circumstances such as Armed Forces, bereavement.
- You may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice of £120 (£60 if paid promptly) per parent with Parental Responsibility, per child if you take your child out for an unauthorised holiday: referrals are made for all holidays of 5 days or more, then you will be referred for a Fixed Penalty Notice from West Sussex County Council.

Why is it important for my child to be in school?





Download the Pulborough Giant's WildArt Trail App onto your smartphone for FREE! Just search for Pulborough WildArt Trail App and get it now.*

The Giant will magically appear to tell you all about his wonderful wildlife friends. Within the app there is also the option of finding all about the fascinating local history and wildlife and inspiration behind the sculptures.

The walk is on public footpaths or roads. Allow 1.5 to 3.5 hours. Please keep to the paths and keep dogs on the lead. In winter, parts may be very wet or even flooded.

The 100 Compass Bus serves both ends of the trail, hourly Monday to Saturday.

PULBOROUGH WILDART TRAIL


Welcome to the Pulborough WildArt Trail, which has been created to enthral walkers, ramblers, nature lovers, art lovers and families.

This is a 4km (approximately 2.5 mile) walking trail from the RSPB's Nature Reserve at Wiggonholt, across Pulborough's Wildbrooks, to Lower Street and then on across East Glebe Field to Pulborough Station, via Church Place (or vice versa).

The route is highlighted by 17 specially designed wildlife themed sculptures by renowned Sussex based artist Steve Gelliot. There are also creative way markers and information boards along the route.


