Parenting course – Last week I put some information in the newsletter about parenting courses. If you would like an online course then this would be the link.



We were also fortunate to have the opportunity to take part in a rainforest themed workshop to extend our knowledge about this environment and some of the animals that inhabit it. We have been doing some lovely leaf rubbing, leaf painting, counting and sorting sizes of leaves and conkers and making spiced playdough. In fun phonics we looked at the letter 's' and practiced making the sound and doing lovely activities with Janna. We had a lovely afternoon last Friday with our Macmillan coffee afternoon and managed to raise £22.80 which we have added to the school total fund.



#### Jiminy's Holiday Club Admissions Policy and Conditions of Registration

#### **Admissions Policy**

- Spaces will be accessible to all sections of the community.
- Spaces will be allocated as follow:
  - $\circ$  1st priority: pupils from St Mary's C of E (Aided) Primary School with siblings already attending Jiminy's;
  - o 2nd priority: other pupils from St Mary's C of E (Aided) Primary School;
- Registration forms and payment need to be received at least five working days prior to the start of the Holiday Club.
- A Child may only attend once you have received a confirmation letter.
- We promote equality of opportunity for all children without any discrimination on the grounds of sex, race, religion, colour, creed, marital status, ethnic or national origin, or political belief. We recognise that parents are young children's first educators and welcome their involvement.
- Our aim is that each child should be recognised and appreciated; each child have access to all
  activities, regardless of ability; gender, ability, race, colour, background, origins.
- The criteria are set out with full commitment to Equal Opportunities. They are also to be read in conjunction with 'conditions of registration' that parents/guardians must read and sign before their child is admitted to Jiminy's.
- Detailed policies and procedures are available to everyone at all times.

#### Conditions of Registration

- You must inform us by 8am via text or phone should your child be absent.
- Children who are collected late (after 3.30pm) will incur a late collection charge of £1 per minute.
   Money collected from late collection will be divided between the staff that have stayed beyond their contracted hours.
- No refund will be offered for non attendance.
- Should your child be unwell he/she may be sent home.
- Your child may not be able to attend Jiminy's if he/she has certain illnesses.
- You are required to inform us as soon as any contact details change.
- Concerns and complaints: Please discuss any concerns or complaints with the manager or supervisor. Should the matter not be resolved to your satisfaction, you may contact OFSTED directly.
- You must inform Jiminy's in advance if someone other than the named person will be collecting your child. Your child will not be released otherwise.
- At least two weeks' written notice is required if you wish to reduce the number of sessions or give notice.
- We reserve the right to refuse a registration.
- We reserve the right to cancel a registration without notice should an adult or child's behaviour is aggressive, abusive, inappropriate or unacceptable.
- We reserve the right to make any adjustments with short notice.
- By signing the registration form, you agree to all of the conditions of registration.
