Time Activities



You can see all the times and Spanish vocabulary to help you to practise telling the time in Spanish.

FOR EXAMPLE:

To say "It is 12 o'clock." (Son las doce en punto.) = It is exactly 12 o'clock.

"menos" means "less". "y" means "and."

So to say "It is twenty to eight." (= Son las ocho menos veinte.)

¿Qué hora es? (What time is it?)

Answers: Es la una en punto. (It is one o'clock.)

Son las tres en punto. (It is three o'clock.)

Son las dos y cuarto. (It is a quarter past two.)

Son las doce y media. (It is half past twelve.)

Son las nueve menos cuarto. (It is a quarter to nine.)
