Three governors of the committee.

Meetings

Not less than once per term, with additional meetings as necessary

The governors will ensure the Ethos of the school is a practical expression of the schools mission statement:

'A Christ centred school with a child centred curriculum. At St. Mary's School, in partnership with parents, we are striving to provide children with an excellent education in a Christian environment. Children are working towards becoming independent learners capable of making choices, becoming self-disciplined and forming positive relationships. Through a varied and flexible approach, education will be appropriate to the child's ability, needs and talents.'

The Committee will therefore:

- 1. review and monitor the implementation of the Collective Worship policy;
- 2. monitor the schools provision for acts of collective worship.
- 3. review the Religious Education policy and ensure appropriate provision for Religious Education within the curriculum;
- 4. review the anti-bullying policy;
- 5. review the Sex and Relationship policy;
- 6. ensure thriving links with St Mary's Church
- 7. ensure there is consultation with the incumbent on worship in church and the Eucharist in school;
- 8. monitor provision for the Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development of the pupils and review the SMSC policy;
- 9. ensure provision of links with the wider community;
- 10. ensure the ethos of the school is one based on the Christian principles of mutual respect and concern for others;
- contribute, receive and approve the Church of England Self Evaluation tool kit.
