With a child at home and a part-time job too, I am still able to attend meetings that are held in the evening around once a month which makes it all very manageable. The role of a governor is not to tell the school what to do, our Senior Leadership Team deals with this, our role is to provide strategic direction (this sounds a lot more complex than it actually is). This means that we contribute ideas to help the school to continue to improve and make good progress. We are there to challenge choices and hold them accountable; we are really like a critical friend.

There is training available and the support from everyone is amazing. No question is too much for them to answer, and, trust me, I have asked many questions.

As a parent governor, I feel that I can bring my views as a parent to the meetings. Every governor brings a different element, which helps to ensure a diversity within the governing board.

I really enjoy being part of the meetings and hearing about all the exciting things that are happening within school. It has made me realise why things happen in school and the implications of every decision made too. All that is essential is a commitment to supporting our school to ensure that St Mary's continues to deliver the best educational experiences for all of the children that attend. "
