Numeracy - Work will always be differentiated to suit the needs of the child.

30.04.18	REVISION: W11 HT Addition, subtraction, Long multiplication and division, application to word problems in the context of area and perimeter.

Science - We will complete our study of Living Things and Their Habitats and then learn about Animals including Humans.

Computing - We will be looking at handling data and multimedia before half term and then continuing with our work on programming after half term.

R.E. - The children will learn about 'People of God', 'Kingdom of God' and Islam.

PSHCE - Mrs Robinson will look at the 'Prevent Agenda'.

Art - We will learn about perspective and shading during Art week and choosing an artist to learn more about.

Music - we will learn and perform the songs for our production!

D&T - the children will investigate the link with Mayans and chocolate and, hopefully, apply these to some interesting recipes.

MFL - the children will learn Spanish after SATs.

P.E. - the children will need their P.E. kits to be left in school everyday for the whole of the summer term. Please ensure the kit is named. Swimming sessions will run on a **Monday** and **Friday**. The children will need swimming costumes/shorts/trunks, towel, underwear (particularly if they've worn their swimming costumes under their clothes in the morning which will help on both days!) and, if hair is longer than shoulder length, a swim hat. Other useful items include deodorant (no sprays), talcum powder and a hairbrush. Please ensure your child does not have any gel in their hair on a swim day as it affects the chemical levels in the pool. Please supply children with sun-cream and a hat on hot days and waterproof coats on wet days - we like to swim rain, wind or

shine! Unfortunately, the school is no longer able to provide verruca socks for sale and so children will need to have their own with them if needed. If a child has a verruca but no sock to wear, they will be unable to swim that day.
