Here is a brief outline of the topics and areas we will be covering during the coming term. Obviously some of the content refers to teaching conducted in school which may not apply to you whilst you are home-schooling.

Here is an update of some of the themes and units of work that we will be tackling this coming term.

Overall Themes

This term our Topic is 'The Great Fire of London' and we will be linking our English outcomes to our learning in History and Geography. Across other curriculum areas, our topic will also be a stimulus for our Art pieces, as well as support for our development of Science and DT products.

English

In English, our focus shifts from fiction - poetry, descriptive writing and narrative - which we studied in the Autumn term, and we turn our attention to non-fiction writing.

1. Immersing ourselves in factual writing, we shall delve into a range of historical recounts to help us learn about the past and show us how to write about the long-gone events of the Great Fire of London.
2. Applying our descriptive writing from last term, we will study letters and write our own by adding detail through the use of adjectives and noun phrases.
3. We shall also try our hand at instructional writing, choosing accurate language to create a clear and ordered set of actions to help the reader follow a strict process to create a desired result.

Each of these units will help us to develop our reading, writing and speaking and listening skills, as we also continue to focus on our phonics, spelling, and sentence construction.

Please continue to read with your child at least three times a week and note this reading down in your child's Home School Notebook if their Reading Log is in school. Please make use of myON for access to many free online books.

Maths

Year 2,

We will continue to work on the key principles of number while acquiring and consolidating skills in Multiplication and Division, Statistics, Shape and Fractions. We will have a real focus on the application of these skills to solving real-life problems.

Year 1,

We will continue to grow pupils' mathematical fluency of number through addition and subtraction and place value within 50. This term they will also be introduced to measurement, including weight and volume. Pupils will practise their problem-solving and reasoning skills by applying their learning to discrete challenges.

Please continue to encourage your child to use My Maths and Numbots/ Times Table Rockstars to develop their fluency.

Computing

The children will continue to develop their computing skills by undertaking a range of exciting tasks from our new scheme of learning, 'Purple Mash'. In digital literacy, we work together as a community to learn our way around Google Classroom, while also revising the importance of Internet Safety so that we are keeping ourselves safe online.

Science

Unit 1 - Everyday Materials and their uses (linked with History and DT)

We shall explore and compare different materials, sorting them into groups and describing their properties. Consider what it would be like if the tables were made of jelly or the chairs were chocolate ice-cream?! Linking learning from the Great Fire of London, we will recreate the story of the Three Little Pigs. Why? So that we can hone our scientific skills of prediction and decide what will happen to their houses as we design the materials with which we build. This will link to our design and make process in DT, where we shall build a model of the perfect house using recycled materials found in our house and school.

Unit 2 - Plants (linked with ART)

As we wake from our mid-February half term hibernation, we hope the sun makes more of an appearance! As the warmer weather begins to return, we will explore outside and prepare tubs for planting flowers and food. Another magic beanstalk has appeared? Let's record the growth of a bean and look at how it develops to improve our skills of measuring, recording and observing. Can you model the plant with craft materials? Can you label the parts of the plant? We will look closely at different plants and recreate what we see!

Religious Education

Who Made the World?

Exploring the story of The Creation, we learn about how Christians believe the world was made and the importance of our place in it.
