The volume and speed of traffic along Lower St has been steadily increasing over the past few years. The Parish Council has been working with WSCC Highways to find a way of slowing the traffic down and making it safer for pedestrians, particularly along the area from Boomerang Barber Shop to Beneficial Health Food Store.

West Sussex County Council (WSCC) Highways have come up with a couple of solutions (see options 1 & 2 below) which the Parish Council think would be possible bearing in mind vehicles do tend to drive towards the middle of the road to avoid parked delivery lorries. These options would protect the delivery bays which would be beneficial to the local shops as well as making it safer for pedestrians to walk along Lower Street.

As you are aware, the Pulborough WildArt Trail has now been launched and this is an added reason for priority to be given to making this area safe for families to use.

Consultation is therefore being sought, from surrounding residents and businesses, for the Parish Council to apply for a Community Highway Scheme for one of the two options to be assessed by WSCC.

Please can you let the Parish Council know which option you would support, by returning the reply slip below to the Parish Office in the Village Hall, Swan View, Lower St, RH20 2BF. Alternatively, you can telephone, email (details above) or respond to posts on social media. All responses to be received by 11<sup>th</sup> October 2019.

#### Option 1

 A priority working with eastbound traffic giving way to westbound traffic. This would work by installing a build out and give way marking that all eastbound traffic has to stop at. They will only be allowed to move forward when westbound traffic has cleared.

#### Option 2

• A priority working with westbound traffic giving way to eastbound traffic. Similar to option 1 but with westbound traffic having to stop, probably outside the General Stores.

For both options 1 & 2 it would likely be possible, as part of the one way working to have a wider loading bay as well as wider footway on the north side of the road.

## Circus Scarecrows

How to make a scarecrow (there are lots of ways to make a scarecrow but if you don't know where to start, maybe try this):

- 1. Find some old clothes (ones that are no longer needed) and look out for household rubbish that could come in handy! Is your scarecrow performing a trick or a balancing act?
- 2 Then you will need a big pole (broom handles or bamboo canes can be good).
- 3. Stuff the scarecrow's trousers with hay, newspaper or some old rags. Use rope or an old belt to tie the trousers to the pole (you can thread the pole down one of the legs)
- 4. Tie across another pole to form the arms (again a broomstick handle is a good size). Put an old shirt or top onto the cross and tie it in place, then tuck the top it into the trousers and stuff this too 5. Now for the head you can stuff a shopping bag or old pillow case or use a football or balloon
- 6. Push or tie the head onto the top of the main pole and maybe even put a top hat or head dress on top
