Computing - We will be revising eSafety through the following units:

- Talking safely online
- Privacy Rules
- What's Cyberbullying?

History/Computing - Children will create a movie trailer based in a historical setting of World War 2. This will tie into our literacy unit and will look at historical differences of World War 1 and World War 2.

R.E. - The children will learn about Christianity through three units:

- What does it mean if God is holy and loving?
- Creation and science: conflicting or complementary?
- Was Jesus the Messiah?

These lessons will be shared with the other Y6 class.

PSHCE - We will cover two SEAL units which are 'New Beginnings' and 'Relationships'. We will begin Sex Education just before half term and more information will follow on this in due course.

Art - The children will learn about pencil sketching and link their art work to WW1 and 2.

Music - The children will continue to learn the ukulele with Mr Rogers. They will learn songs from WW2. They may have the opportunity to go to the Weald for music enrichment either this term or Spring term.

D&T - The children will be design and make an Anderson Shelter.

P.E. - The children will need their P.E. kits on **Wednesday** and **Thursday** each week. Please ensure the kit is named. One session will be based outdoors (weather permitting) and one session indoors (Wednesday - gymnastics). Outdoor sessions will cover football and netball. Children will need P.E. shirts and shorts, outdoor shoes, long trousers and jumper or tracksuit for outdoors. They will need swimming kit on Tuesday for the first part of the term.

Homework:

- Reading logs - please ensure your child reads to you weekly and this is signed and dated. This will form an important part of my assessment for reading and dialogue between home and school. They will be collected in and marked each week and should please be in school every day.
- Weekly spellings - these will be sent home on a Tuesday and tested the following week.
- Homework - Homework will be set on a grid format enabling children to work to specific interests.

Fund raising for the Big Top

As you are aware the Year 6/KS2 summer production usually takes place within a Big Top tent. This requires a large amount of fundraising throughout the year to enable this (and the summer ball) to take place. It would be fantastic if you could start thinking about something you and your child could do to contribute.
