All of the children have made us so proud this week. What a lovely week with the Nativities, the Christmas Eucharist and other celebrations. It has also been lovely to see so many parents and chat with them.

Attendance certificates – Attendance certificates will be coming home next week for those children who have 100% attendance for this term. We are keen to get attendance as high as possible as there is a direct link between attendance and those getting to Age Related Expectation. Please continue to support us with this.

Update from Christingle – The Christingle service raised £248.92 collected in total. Thank you to all those contributed.

PTA update - This term we have made over £3,500 from all the events, raffles and donations. Payments of £2,300 have been made to the school including paying for the pantomime, crackers for Christmas lunch and book bags for reception. We have been making salt dough decorations and decorating biscuits. We have also been singing Christmas songs and listening to Christmas stories. Outside the children have been digging in the giant sandpit and splashing in puddles as well as using chalk to draw around items the children have found.

Our school milk scheme - Did you know our school has a school milk scheme? By registering your child for our school milk scheme they will receive a 189ml (third of a pint) carton of semi-skimmed milk every day. This is delivered fresh and chilled to their classroom every day.

"How much does it cost?" - Thanks to government subsidies, school milk is free for all under-fives and is subsided at around £15 a term for children aged five or older.

"Why should I register my child?" - School milk provides your child with essential nutrients such as calcium and protein, for strong, healthy teeth and bones. It is also rehydrating and energy boosting, helping to bridge the long gap between breakfast and lunch so children stay focused.

"How do I register my child?" - If your child is under five-

- 1. Go to <u>www.coolmilk.com</u> or pick up a form from school.
- 2. Just register by a Tuesday for your child's free milk to start the following week.
- 1. Free milk will continue until the Friday before your child's fifth birthday. You will receive a payment request three weeks before this time- if you wish for your child to continue to receive school milk simply make a payment.

If your child is over five-

- 1. Go to <u>www.coolmilk.com</u> or pick up a form from school.
- 2. Pay Cool Milk online, over the phone, at a local PayPoint or by cheque in instalments to suit you. If registering online you can pay straight away, if using a registration form you will need to wait to receive a payment request.
- 3. Just pay by a Tuesday for your child's milk to start the following week.

Performance data – The performance tables have been released by the Government and our KS2 attainment data was disappointing especially in Maths. We had some real successes across the school though with 88% of Early Years achieving a good level of development. This is the highest percentage of children for three years. Year 1 phonics score is the highest for three years as well with 87% of children achieving the standards. Key Stage One data shows more strengths in Maths for the majority and children working at greater depth has improved. The monitoring of lessons and books shows there is evidence of progress right across the school and all the teachers are looking forward to sharing this at parent's evenings in the Spring Term. We are constantly striving to improve the teaching and learning for the children and so school priorities have been identified and are being worked on. School priorities are improving attendance of our children, helping the children with test situations, progress to be rapid in all year groups across reading, writing and maths and to raise Maths attainment in Key Stage 2. We also want to improve the engagement of all children but especially boys. The website has the School priorities laid out if you wish to have a more detailed look.

Report by William Orrell – On the 10th December the Reception classes performed an excellent nativity called Stable By Starlight featuring songs such as 'Going to be counted', 'no more room', 'Where's the star' to name a few. There were all kinds of people such as shepherds, kings, Mary and Joseph and of course, baby Jesus. The audience looked like they were enjoying themselves. I even saw some stomping their feet! My rating is ten out of ten and I am sure everyone else felt the same.

Led By A Star – Friday `14th December is Led By A Star. A lantern procession following a giant star will start at The Chequers at 6pm or the village hall at 6.30pm and there will be a visit by Santa and his elves and some singing from our school choir. It is organised by the local churches and some of the profits will be coming back to the school.
