We spent the day out in the Forest Schools area where Mrs Agate had arranged several activities, from this period of our history. The children learned how to make mats and mattresses from hay; drew pictures using paint made from natural resources such as charcoal, spun wool using stones, built shelters and even threw the odd spear....at imaginary Stone Age animals such as the Woolly Mammoth and Saber-toothed Tiger. 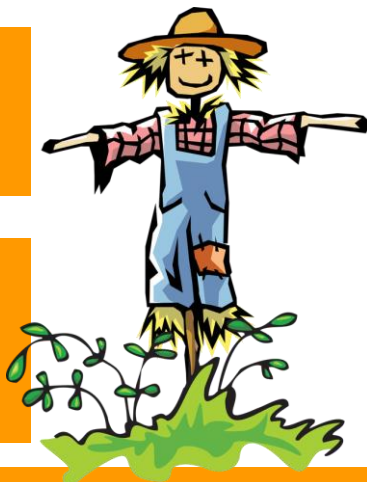
