Reading Challenge –The children of Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 have come back to school to a Reading Challenge. This is to encourage the children to try high quality, engaging texts and show them that they can tackle something more challenging and to increase the pace and frequency of the books that we are reading. The Key Stage 2 children have a reading passport and a 'London Underground' display. There will be prizes for each class for the child that reads the most and for the child that reads the most books from a particular genre as listed on the display.
