Theme for the term -Moving on and Shakespeare

We will be learning about some of Shakespeare's most famous plays and how the stories and plot lines are so relevant today. We will also be learning about ourselves and how to hope with changes and moving on.

Science – We will learn about the theories of Evolution and Inheritance and then learn about Animals including Humans. This will continue to be taught by Miss Davies on a Thursday.

Computing – we will be looking at handling data and multimedia before half term and then continuing with our work on programming after half term.

R.E. – the children will learn about 'People of God', 'Kingdom of God' and Islam.

PSHCE – we will look at the 'Prevent Agenda' in addition to transition activities and looking at issues such as peer pressure and dangerous substances.

Art – we will learn about collage during the term and during Art week.

Music – we will learn and perform the songs for our production!

D&T – the children will investigate the link with fruit, sugar and healthy eating. They will create and sell their own smoothie recipes linking with maths ration and money.

MFL – the children will learn Spanish and build on their skills that they have already.

P.E. – the children will need their P.E. kits on a **Thursday** for athletics. However, it would be useful for P.E. kits to be left in school **everyday** for the whole of the summer term. Ensure the kit is named. Swimming sessions will run on a **Monday**. As Japan class will miss a number of sessions due to Bank Holidays, there is a list of extra sessions that we have booked. *Please see below for the details and dates of*

these. The children will need swimming costumes/shorts/trunks, towel, underwear (particularly if they've worn their swimming costumes under their clothes in the morning!) and, if hair is longer than shoulder length, a swim hat. Other useful items include deodorant (no sprays), talcum powder and a hairbrush. Please ensure your child does not have any gel in their hair on a swim day as it affects the chemical levels in the pool. Please supply children with sun-cream and a hat on hot days and waterproof coats on wet days - we like to swim rain, wind or shine! Unfortunately, the school is no longer able to provide verruca socks for sale and so children will need to have their own with them if needed. If a child has a verruca but no sock to wear, they will be unable to swim that day.
